**PROGRAM POLICIES**

Majors must achieve a minimum G.P.A of 2.0 in Psychology courses.  
 Students must earn a grade of C or higher in each PSY course or prerequisite course that they take. If the course serves as a prerequisite for another, they must earn at least a C to advance in the sequence.  
 Psychology majors should meet with their academic advisor each semester to discuss scheduling of classes in light of specific career goals.

**GENERAL EDUCATION NOTES**

General Education courses are identified in blue.

- Specific courses that fulfill SEE general education requirements are listed in the catalog and on the portal.
- Students must complete all general education and major requirements and earn a minimum of 120 credits.
- 15 credits must be taken at the 300 or 400 level.
- All courses in the student's last 30 credits must be taken at Stevenson.

\*\*SOCIAL SCIENCE classes must be from two different disciplines
